RE: Investing in Canadian Infrastructure Program (ICIP) -COVID-19 Stream

Jason Morrow and Clayton Seymour presented drawings for a 40'x 22' addition to the fire hall. The addition is an eligible expenditure under ICIP's Covid-19 Resilience Stream and the total cost is expected to be under the Township of Hudson's \$100,000 allocation. The addition would provide the fire department with a suitable space for meetings and training. It would also free up additional space within the existing firehall that could be used to store the fire department's rescue van. Due to a lack of space, the rescue van is stored in the old fire hall. Once relocated, the old fire hall could be used by the Roads Department to store its second plow truck.

a. Municipal Finance Officer's Association of Ontario – Extension of Reg 588/17 Deadline

2020-157 **Moved:** Martin Woods Seconded: Dan Morrow WHEREAS the COVID-19 pandemic has had significant financial and operational impacts on Ontario municipalities;

AND WHEREAS municipalities have had to divert resources towards addressing the immediate needs of the pandemic and maintaining service delivery standards despite evolving restrictions and limited funds;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Ontario has delayed timelines with respect to several pieces of legislation;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Ontario has regulated municipal asset management through O.Reg. 588/17: Asset Management Planning for Municipal Infrastructure under the Infrastructure for Jobs and Prosperity Act, 2015;

AND WHEREAS O.Reg. 588/17 mandates that every municipality shall prepare an asset management plan in respect of its core municipal infrastructure assets by July 1st, 2021, and in respect of all its other municipal infrastructure assets by July 1, 2023;

AND WHEREAS the key components of an asset management plan as required by the regulation are:

- 1. Infrastructure asset inventory
- 2. Levels of service
- 3. Lifecycle management and financial strategy

AND WHEREAS there is concern amongst Municipal Finance Offers' Association of Ontario (MFOA) members and their municipalities that current capacity challenges (redeployment of staff, and lack of available resources) will result in limitations for purposeful asset management planning;

AND WHEREAS Ontario municipalities do not anticipate the current capacity challenges to be resolved in the short-term;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TOWNSHIP OF HUDSON supports MFOA's letter to the Ministry of Infrastructure requesting a one-year extension of deadlines in O.Reg. 588/17: Asset Management Planning for Municipal Infrastructure under the Infrastructure for Jobs and Prosperity Act, 2015; so that all municipalities can focus on the immediate needs of the pandemic and engage in municipal asset management planning when capacity challenges are resolved.
