WHEREAS the role of Ontario's 411 fire departments and their approximate 30,000 full, part time, and volunteer firefighters is to protect Ontarians and their property; and

WHEREAS according to the Ontario Fire Marshal and emergency Management's latest data, in Ontario there was over 11,000 number of loss fires, 9,500 no loss fires, 784 injuries, 91 fatalities, and over \$820 million dollars of estimated loss in 2018; and

WHEREAS fire emergencies only make up a portion of the total calls help received by fire and emergency service departments as the respond to nearly every public emergency, disaster, or 9-1-1 call and

WHEREAS Ontario's fire department infrastructure deficit continues to grow annually and is almost entirely borne by municipality and local taxpayers with the majority having populations under 25,000; and

WHEREAS due to antiquated structures and equipment that do not meet current industry standards the safety of the Ontario public and Ontario firefighters is being jeopardized;
