John Deere is approximately \$590,000 and Sani would be around \$470,000-\$480,000. Possible road projects for 2023 include surface treatment on 1 mile of Sawmill Road, repairs to 1 mile of Milberta Road (Morrow Rd to Uno Park Rd), repairs to Morrow Rd (Foley Rd to Hwy 65), surface treatment on A3, and culverts are also needed on Hillview Road.

AND WHEREAS, if Enbridge is successful in implementing this new charge, a precedence is set for other utility companies to also begin charging for locates;
