a. Brent Parsons M. Sc. I Senior Aquatic Scientist - Lake Capacity Study (virtual presentation)

Brent Parsons from Hutchinson Environmental Sciences Ltd. presented the lakes capacity assessment report to council. He outlined the objectives, approach, results, and recommendations. The modeling shows that Bartle, Fairy, and Upper Twins Lakes are over capacity and there is no room for development. There remains some capacity for development on Pike and Lower Twin Lakes. There is an increasing trend of phosphorus on Upper and Lower Twin Lakes, and the shallow nature of Pike Lake limits recreational opportunities. Some of the recommendations were to:

- Continue water quality monitoring through the lake partner program.
- Ensure sewage treatment systems meet the standards as outlined in the Ontario Building Code, and replace any dysfunctional systems with ones that meet the OBC requirements.

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- Develop official plan policies for the shoreline development to encouraging naturally vegetated shoreline buffers, prohibit new lot creations on Bartle, Fairy and Upper Twin Lakes.
- Allow additional development on Lower Twin and Pike Lakes but ensure that additional development proceeds in accordance with minimum development standards and best management practices.
