b. Kara Hill - Severance on Road C

Kara Hill addressed council in regards to Reeves Craig's proposal on creating new lots on Road C during the November 2023 council meeting. She expressed to council that she had difficulty obtaining a building permit when constructing her home several years ago as the area is close to the landfill, and believes this may be the case should new building lots be created in this same area. The Clerk-Treasurer provided the response from J.L. Richards after reaching out in regards to Reeve Craig's proposal. The planner responded (by email) that a zoning by-law amendment would be required as the current zoning of this area is C-2 and residential uses are not permitted. Additionally, the Official Plan designates a portion as Waste Disposal (closed), and would therefore trigger an official plan amendment. This amendment would not be supported by the planning act or other provincial policy statements. Council thanked Kara for her presentation.

6. Reports from Staff & Others

a. Road's Department Report

The Road's Superintendent reports that the roads were graded, plowed and sanded as required. Two new laneway culverts were installed. One needed to be dug out and reset. Ditching on Pike Lake was completed and the winter trench was dug at the landfill. Wire was run in the arena for the new fan, floor was swept, and some boards were screwed back on. The Superintendent also reported that the winter sand has been delivered. Tires were installed on the plow trucks and sand screen and lights were also installed. Ice blades and wing posts were put on the grader. New cutting edge and shoes are installed on the one way. Both plow trucks, loader and grader are now able to fit inside the shop.

b. Fire Department Report

Acting Fire Chief Jason Morrow reports that they have had regular business meetings, and discussed purchasing a new generator. An Energizer generator for approximately \$650.00 will be sufficient to fill the need and the Fire Department will purchase. The MNR was contacted about burning slash piles, and they were asked to call the

Township office to notify them on upcoming burning so that the Fire Department and residents can be notified. The water leaks on the pumper were repaired and Department members participated in a training exercise regarding positive pressure ventilation led by Clayton Seymour.

approximately 8,000 essential search and rescue volunteers respond to thousands of incidents every year; and

WHEREAS many of these individuals receive some form of pay on call, an honorarium, or are given some funding to cover expenses, but they do not draw a living wage from firefighting; and

WHEREAS without volunteer firefighters and search and rescue volunteers, thousands of communities in Canada would have no fire and emergency response coverage; and

WHEREAS in 2013, the federal government initiated a tax credit recognizing these individuals, and calling on the federal government to increase this tax credit from \$3,000 to \$10,000; and

WHEREAS volunteer firefighters account for 71% of Canada's total firefighting essential first responders;

- The tax code of Canada currently allows volunteer firefighters and search and rescue volunteers to claim a \$3,000 tax credit if 200 hours of volunteer services were completed in a calendar year;
- This works out to a mere \$450 per year, which we allow these essential volunteers to keep of their own income from their regular jobs, \$2.25 an hour;
- If they volunteer more than 200 hours, which many do, this tax credit becomes even less;
- These essential volunteers not only put their lives on the line and give their time, training and efforts to Canadians, but they also allow cities and municipalities to keep property taxes lower than if paid services were required;
- It would also help retain these volunteers in a time when volunteerism is decreasing.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Hudson call upon the Government of Canada to support Bill C-31O and enact amendments to subsections 118.06 (2) and 118.07 (2) of the Income Tax Act in order to increase the amount of the tax credits for volunteer firefighting and search and rescue volunteer services from \$3,000 to \$10,000; and

Direct municipal staff to issue a copy of this resolution to the Municipality of Wawa, and to the Ontario Association of Fire Chiefs. "CARRIED"
